Ingredients - Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

- 250g sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self-raising flour

- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

Method

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin $\underline{20 \text{ cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin}}$ and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3% - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Ingredients - Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

- 375g mixed fruit
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- ½ cup water
- 125g butter
- ½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
- ½ cup sherry
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 cup plain flour
- ¼ teaspoon salt



Method

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.

Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.

Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

- 2tsp ground cinnamor
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp allspice

- 345g castor sugar
- 375ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)
- 220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- 180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed



Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90 100 minutes.
- 4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

 - 1 tsp ground cinnamon
 - ¼ tsp ground nutmeg
 - 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
 - 1/3 cup chopped pitted dates
 - 1 cup coarsely grated carrot

- 1 tbsp orange marmalade
- 1 cup canola oil
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- ¾ cup orange juice
- 1 cup reduced fat milk



Method

- 1. Pre-heat oven to 190C (moderately hot).
- 2. Line a 12-hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases Classic white muffin cases size (35mm Height x 90mm Wide x 50mm Base).
- 3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in dates and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
- 4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
- 5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
- 6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

- 2. The holder of a Member's Ticket (with one Guest's Ticket) \$50 will be allowed free admission to grounds. No cars will be admitted to the Showgrounds except with special exemption from rule obtained from the Registrar or those showing an Exhibitors's car pass.
- N.B. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property and in possession of the exhibitor at the date of closing of entry.
- 3. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the owner, who, on making the entry, will receive a ticket with the section, class and number theron.4. The Shepparton Agricultural Society Inc reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5. All persons who, after entering exhibits (especially of stock) shall be unable, through some unforeseen circumstances, to exhibit same, will be expected to give notice to the Secretary of their inability to exhibit before Friday 10th September. Post entries excepted.
- 6. All exhibits must be in the showgrounds, and placed ready for judging at time and date shown at head of each section.
