HOW TO ENTER - STEP BY STEP

1. Complete your entry form by finding the Section, Class Number and description fitting your exhibit.
2. Deliver or post your entry form with your fees (found at the beginning of the Section) by the date stated. **ONLY** your **ENTRY FORM** is required at this time.
3. You will receive your exhibit tickets in your self-addressed envelope or call at the office seven (7) days prior to the show. Tickets are to be placed on exhibit either with a small safety pin or stuck on.
4. Judging Days- Please check schedule for Judging Days. Take your exhibit/s with their exhibit tickets on them and deliver to the Craft Pavilion in the showgrounds before 10.30am (or by time stated in schedule).
5. **Collection of exhibits from pavilion** Sunday 11th October from 9.00am-12.00pm (cars permitted on grounds). Prize money will be paid out at the office during this time and will be available during office hours up until Friday 16th October 2026.

VAS COOKERY

If you mention country shows to anyone all over Australia the conversation will inevitably turn to fruit cakes, who has the best recipe, how big the cake should be, how long to soak the dried fruit, whether to use sherry or brandy, (or better, both) and which tin to use, how much shrinkage is allowable in the cooked cake, the list goes on. In fact, baking fruit cakes is more than a time-honoured tradition: fruit cake is the number one VAS competition as far as sheer numbers of exhibits go. That's a whole lot of cake.

6101 VAS LTD RICH FRUIT CAKE

VAS LTD RICH FRUIT CAKE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The entrant must follow the recipe and specifications provided below.
2. Each cake entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
3. Professionals are not eligible, which is defined as someone that works professionally or derives the greater percentage of their income in that craft, art form or technique.
4. The Rich Fruit Cake competition follows the three levels of competition: Show Level, Group Level and State Level.
5. An exhibitor having won at their local show, will bake another cake for the 2027 Group Final and then the winner of the Group Final will bake another cake for the State Final at the 2027 Royal Melbourne Show.
6. An exhibitor having won at their local Show is not eligible to enter any other Show until after the Group Final judging.

Hot Tips for exhibitors: A well-kept competition cake making secret: lay a tea towel over the cake rack before turning the cake out to prevent the imprint of the cake rack appearing on your competition cake.

Ingredients - Preferred 100% Australian grown Produce. 250g Sultanas, 250g Chopped Raisins, 250g Currants, 125g Chopped Mixed Peel, 90g Chopped Red Glace Cherries, 90g Chopped Blanched Almonds, 1/3 Cup Sherry or Brandy, 250g Plain Flour, 60g Self Raising Flour, 1/4 teaspoon Grated Nutmeg, 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Ginger, 1/2 teaspoon Ground Cloves, 250g Butter, 250g Soft Brown Sugar, 1/2 teaspoon Lemon Essence OR finely grated Lemon Rind, 1/2 teaspoon Almond Essence, 1/2 Teaspoon Vanilla Essence, 4 Large Eggs.

Method: Cut the fruit and almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin **20cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Hot Tip: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 or 4 pieces.

Ingredients: - Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce 375g mixed fruit, 1/2 cup sherry, 3/4 cup brown sugar, 2 eggs, lightly beaten, 1 teaspoon mixed spice, 2 tablespoons marmalade, 1/2 cup water, 1 cup S.R. Flour, 125g butter, 1 cup Plain flour, 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate soda, 1/4 teaspoon salt.

Method: Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from the stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

Ingredients: 375g Plain flour, 2 tsp Baking powder, 1 1/2 tsp bicarb soda, 2 tsp ground cinnamon, 1/2 tsp ground nutmeg, 1/2 tsp allspice, pinch of salt, 345g caster sugar, 350ml vegetable oil, 4 eggs, 3 medium carrots- grated(350g), 220g tin crushed pineapple-drained, 180g pecans-coarsely crushed.

Method: Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan). Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil,



then add to dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into cake tin. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Up-end and allow to cool on the wire rack.

Ingredients: 2 1/2 cups SR flour, 1 tsp ground cinnamon, 1/4 tsp ground nutmeg, 1 cup brown sugar, (firmly packed), 1/3 cup Sultanas chopped in half, 1 cup coarsely grated carrot, 1 tbsp orange marmalade, 1 cup canola oil, 2 eggs-lightly beaten, 3/4 cup orange juice, 1 cup reduced fat milk.

Method: Preheat oven to 190C (moderately hot)-Line a 12 hole muffin pan with Round Paper Muffin Cases. Classic white Muffin Case size can vary between (30-40mm height x 70-80mm wide x 45-55mm base) Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in sultanas and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.

Spoon mixture evenly into Muffin Paper cases in tin muffin pan.

Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked, insert cake skewer: if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.

Stand Muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

- Open to ambassadors aged between 16 and 19 years on the day of their Local Show.
- Each Show can run a Junior Show Ambassador Show qualifier and the winner at Show Level then represents the Show at the Group Final.
- An ambassador having won at their Local Show Level is not eligible to enter any other Show or represent another group.
- The winner of the Group Final then represents the Group at the State Final, which is held at the annual VAS Convention.
- Each Finalist will be judged based on the criteria below.
- At the State Final the Finalists will need to provide a cover letter and resume that will be given to the judges.
- Each Finalist will be interviewed by a panel of three judges and the winner will be announced at the Convention Dinner.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- **Local Show Involvement (15 Points)** – Entrants must demonstrate an active involvement and a desire to be involved in the future and improvement of their Local Show Society.

- **General and Rural Knowledge (15 Points)** – Entrants must demonstrate a broad general knowledge and an awareness of Local/National Community issues. Entrant must also have an understanding of current affairs relating to rural life and industry.
- **Personality and Confidence (10 Points)** – Personality Traits consistent with both the awards and the entrant’s ambitions and goals will be assessed (e.g. enthusiasm, creativity, confidence, leadership).
- **Ambitions/Goals (20 Points)** - Each Entrant’s ambitions and goals will be assessed on their integrity and relevance to the awards. Entrants must demonstrate steps towards achieving their goal.

RULES & REGULATIONS - RURAL AMBASSADOR AWARD

- Open to ambassadors aged between 20 and 30 years as of the 1st May 2027 and the finalist must reside in Victoria.
- Each Show can run a Rural Ambassador Show qualifier and the winner at Show Level then represents the Show at the Group Final.
- An ambassador having won at their local Show Level is not eligible to enter any other Show or represent another group.
- A maximum of 12 finalists will be eligible for the State Final with preference to all Group Final winners and each runner up of each group will be considered. If numbers exceed 12 finalist’s interviews will be held at the information day to determine the remaining State Finalists.
- The State Final is held at the Melbourne Royal Show and each finalist is judged based on the criteria below.
- Each Finalist will need to supply a resume with a cover letter and a draft/copy of speech for the State Final, which will be given to the judges of the State Final.



- Each Finalist will be interviewed by a panel of three judges and the State Finalist will need to present a speech at the presentation function. The winner will be announced at the presentation function.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- **Local Show Involvement (25 Points)** – Entrants must demonstrate an active involvement and a desire to be involved in the future and improvement of their Local Show Society.
- **Community Involvement (20 Points)** - Entrants must demonstrate an active involvement and a desire to be involved in the future and improvement of their Local Community.
- **General and Rural Knowledge (20 Points)** – Entrants must demonstrate a broad general knowledge and an awareness of Local/National Community issues. Entrant must also have an understanding of current affairs relating to rural life and industry.
- **Personality & Communication Skills (20 Points)** – Personality Traits consistent with both the awards and the entrant’s ambitions and goals will be assessed (e.g. enthusiasm, creativity, confidence, leadership). Also, entrants are expected to demonstrate effective communication skills – written, oral and interpersonal.
- **Ambitions, Goals & Interests (15 Points)** - Each Entrants ambitions and goals will be assessed on their integrity and relevance to the award. Entrants must demonstrate steps towards achieving their goal.
- **Style, Grooming & Presentation (10 Points)** – Entrants presentation will be assessed according to the suitability of their attire and conduct in a range of contexts.
- **Conduct (10 Points)** – How the entrant behaves and demonstrates appropriate behaviour in each setting eg. being polite, well dressed and soft spoken.
- **Public Presentation (3-minute speech) (20 Points)** – Entrants public presentation will be assessed according to the quality of the content, delivery and the extent to which it addresses the set topic.

Exhibitors are particularly requested to READ REGULATIONS CAREFULLY. – They will be STRICTLY ADHERED TO.

N.B.: Entries of exhibits are only received subject to the following regulations:

RIGHT OF ENTRY AND FEES

1–All general entries must be made in writing, on forms supplied by the Society, and signed by or on behalf of the exhibitor, and delivered to the Secretary, Showgrounds, Shepparton, on or before the specified closing dates. The time for closing the entries will be strictly adhered to. **NO LATE ENTRIES. POST ENTRIES EXCEPTED.**

2–The holder of a Member's Ticket (with one Guest's Ticket) \$50 will be allowed free admission to grounds. No cars will be admitted to the Showgrounds except with special exemption from rule obtained from the Registrar or those showing an exhibitor's car pass.

N.B.: All exhibits must be the bona-fide property and in possession of the exhibitor at date of closing of entry.

3–All exhibits must be entered in the name of the owner, who, on making the entry, will receive a ticket with the section, class and number thereon.

4–The Shepparton Agricultural Society reserves the right to refuse any entry.

5–All persons who, after entering exhibits (especially of stock) shall be unable, through some unforeseen circumstances, to exhibit same, will be expected to give notice to the Secretary of their inability to exhibit on or before Tuesday, 6th October. Post entries excepted.

6–All exhibits must be in the showgrounds, and placed ready for judging at time and date shown at head of each section.

7–No person shall show the same exhibit or part of exhibit in more than one class. This does not apply to dogs or horses.

8–No exhibit competing will be allowed to wear any ribbon, badge or mark until it has been finally judged. Only awards granted at the present show of the Shepparton Agricultural Society may be worn or attached to any exhibit on the Showgrounds. Any exhibitor offending is under a penalty of \$10 for each offence.

9–All debts to the Society must be finalised by the due date otherwise entries and or ground space may be refused at future exhibitions.

10–No exhibitor will be allowed in that section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication, unless with the consent of the Stewards of the class in which his exhibit is entered, and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any persons interfering with the judges, and, if necessary, order the removal of such offenders from the yard, and the prize (if any) awarded to such person may be forfeited.

11–Deleted.

12–All exhibitors shall permit the Stewards to affix their prize cards notifying the awards of the judges, and shall permit same to remain affixed during the continuance of the show.

13–(a) Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules and regulations and by-laws of the Society and of the Show;

- (b) the entrant agrees to be bound by those rules and regulations and by-laws;
- (c) the entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by VASA pursuant to those rules and regulations and by-laws; and
- (d) no decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.

14–All machinery in motion shall be either securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.

15–Each dog must have a lead and the Society’s ticket with the number thereon, without which they will not be allowed to enter the judging ring.

15a–Boundaries between VCA Dogs and Machinery Stands must be abided by or the offender will be removed from the grounds.

16–Water will be provided for stock, etc., but exhibitors must provide their own forage, etc., and manufacturers must also furnish price lists at which they can supply the article exhibited.

17–The Committee may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements of entries. They may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if members shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors may be required to make a statutory declaration regarding their entries if the committee so desires.

18–Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the prize. The Committee of the Society with or without the advice of the judges, shall decide the question.

JUDGES AND STEWARDS

19–JUDGES: No judge shall be an exhibitor in any class in which he acts as judge.

20–STEWARDS: Should a steward happen to be an exhibitor in any class in which he is a steward, he must stand aside during the judging of such class and take no part whatever in it. Stewards are requested to observe this rule.

EXHIBITORS, STANDHOLDERS, SIDESHOW “PETS”

22–Dogs must be tied up “inside” floats or trucks or vehicles or caravans.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

23–All Dairy Cattle must be on exhibition two days of show.

24–No exhibit, excepting livestock on one-day exhibition, which may be removed at 3.00 p.m. on day of exhibition. Removal of Exhibits will take place, Sunday, October 11th.

TERMS AND TIMES OF ADMISSION TO THE SHOW

25–The exhibition will be open to all Members of the Society who have paid their subscription for the current year on presentation of their member’s tickets, which will also admit one guest and such members of their families as do not exceed 15 years of age. Admission fees for 2026 are available on the website. Showtimes 10.00am to 10.00pm both days.

26–None but exhibitors and absolutely indispensable attendants on exhibits will be allowed inside the yards on the morning of the first day of the show.

27–None but parties having charge of exhibits, and who must present a pass from the Secretary, will be allowed within the yards before the time of opening the exhibition.

28–No animals, implements, or vehicles except those entering and

vehicles bringing exhibits will be allowed in the yards and the latter must leave the yards immediately after discharging their loads.

AWARDING OF PRIZES

29–The judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first, or withhold a prize altogether, when the exhibit is not considered worthy.

30–No appeal against the opinion of the judge shall be entertained.

31–**CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS:** The judge shall award Reserve Champion Ribbons in all horse and cattle classes in which Champion awards are made. The exhibit second in the class to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Champion.

32–When the judge thinks any stock or article worthy of a prize and there is none offered, their awards shall be taken as a recommendation for the committee's consideration.

PROTESTS

33–All disputes or protests against exhibitors for infringement of these Rules must be made in writing to the Secretary within one hour of the event, and will be dealt with by the Committee of the Society. Ten dollars (\$10) deposit to accompany each protest, which may be forfeited if the Committee considers the protest frivolous, and their decisions shall in all cases be final. All complaints against exhibitors or exhibits must be made in writing, signed by the complainant, and handed to the Secretary by 4.00 p.m. on Sunday, the 12th day of October, 2026.

Protest Committee: K. Winch, F. Hocking, M. McNeill and S. Trevaskis (minimum of three to act).

INFRINGEMENT OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

34–Any member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Committee, and, if found guilty, shall have his name expunged from the roll of members, and be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Committee.

35–Any infringement of these Rules will disqualify an exhibitor from taking a prize.

36–In case of dispute as to the construction of these Regulations or the meaning of anything in the prize list, the same shall be determined by the Committee of the Society, whose decisions in all cases shall be final.

RESPONSIBILITY OF SOCIETY

37–THE COMMITTEE WILL GIVE EVERY POSSIBLE FACILITY TO EXHIBITORS, AND EVERY CARE WILL BE TAKEN OF EXHIBITS, BUT NO RESPONSIBILITY WILL BE INCURRED BY THE SOCIETY, EITHER IN RESPECT OF ANY EXHIBIT OR IN RESPECT OF ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE SUSTAINED BY REASON OF AN EXHIBIT.

38–EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL HOLD THE SOCIETY AND ITS MEMBERS INDEMNIFIED FROM ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE SUSTAINED BY OR BY REASONS OF HIS OR HER EXHIBIT.
